NORTH STAR -Joe Pearsall-burnt down in 1929.

RELIANCE ELEVATOR-- built on spot of North Star-Dan Scheidt. Bought out by Searle Grain-Vern Scheidt, Ed Heiland. Federal amalgamated with Searle. Sask. Wheat Pool bought it out.

(FEDERAL GRAIN-built in 1912—McAuly, Ralph Van Fossen, Johnnie Johnston, Jack Warren, Lee Duprey, Tony Frison)

POOL B-built in 1911—burnt down in 1951 and rebuilt in 1952—Dave Creighton, Ken Campbell, Jack Smith, Rod Cox and Edward Heiland; Jerry Walz—remodelled in 1975 to high output elevator. Burnt down again-1986 –1987-rebuilt as “slip form concrete construction”-\$2,477,000.

SEARLE GRAIN CO.-Archie Wilson, Fred Detert, Ade Granoski, Wm. Nyuli, Jerry Walz. (Searle amalgamated with Federal Grain and was then sold to Sask. Wheat Pool who dismantled it the moved the annex to Pool B.

PIONEER GRAIN-in 1981 a spur was built on south side of the main line and a fully modern elevator build—Agent Bill Dewan; Larry Mann; Warren Semenuk

2008-Prairie West Terminal of Plenty-Dodsland bought out the Pioneer Elevator.-Brad Murphy
