## Luseland Municipal By-Election

Of course, Krystal had to step down as councillor in order to be able to be an employee, so we will be having a by-election September 13, 2023 to fill the empty position. Stay tuned for more news on that front as advance poll dates are solidified and candidates start submitting their nomination papers. If you are thinking about putting your name forward, here are the qualifications you must meet:

- a) Be a Canadian Citizen;
- b) Be at least 18 years of age;
- c) Have resided in Saskatchewan for at least 6 consecutive months preceding the day of the election;
- d) Have lived in Luseland for at least 3 consecutive months immediately preceding the date you submit your nomination paper; and
- e) Not be disqualified pursuant to the Local Government Election Act or any other Act.

### **Reminder**

### **Water News**

So far, we're in a good shape for our water reserves, so it is not necessary to implement restrictions at this point. However, since there are some new people in town, the following is the permitted watering schedule to help keep us that way:

**West Side (Griffin Street west)  
Monday, Wednesday, Friday  
East Side (Griffin Street east)  
Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday  
ABSOLUTELY NO WATERING SUNDAY**

We encourage everyone to do their watering between 7 & 9 AM or between 7 & 9 PM, as the moisture is more likely to soak into the ground and do what you intend rather than evaporate and make the day muggy.

### **H2Notify**

Luseland uses a message system that delivers information to you almost instantly, allowing for faster, better communication of important notifications such as boil water advisories, water line breaks, garbage and recycling disruptions and more. If you are not yet on the list for these types of notifications, it is highly recommended you do so. We post updates on our Facebook Page but not everyone is online. You may come into the Town Office during open hours to request a form to fill out with your contact preferences so we can enter the information into our system.
